- Serendipity based on a strong foundation
- Funded October 1, 2011
 - Strategic planning committee established
- Founded January 1, 2012
- Appropriations from the state of Alabama
 - \$1,100,000 per year





- A deliberate, logical, thoughtful approach to funding cancer research at Auburn
 - Leveraging of funds
 - "Sustainability" plans (for extramural funding)
 - Interdisciplinary Research
 - Collaborative groups
 - Rigorous (constructive) review processes



- 175+ members (and growing!)
- ▶ 75+ faculty
- 9 Colleges/Schools (out of 12)
- 5 other universities
 - National and International
- Multiple collaborations established with biotech and academia
 - e.g. multiple new clinical trials at the College of Veterinary Medicine.

How to Establish Interdisciplinary Teams?





- How to Establish Interdisciplinary Teams?
 - Funding
 - Most AURIC research grants require an interdisciplinary team
 - Typically multiple departments or colleges
 - Emphasized in reviewer briefing and score rubric
 - The "carrot"
 - Encourage "crossover" research



How to Establish Interdisciplinary Teams?

- Interaction Get different people in the same room
 - "Speed dating" approaches
 - Time to talk
 - Places to talk
 - Seminars
 - Program-wide meeting
 - "Matchmakers"



- How to Establish Interdisciplinary Teams?
 - Leverage
 - Encourage \$ contribution from University, College and Dept.
 - Ensure everyone is invested (in the success of the team)
 - Ultimately translates to a culture of institutional support



How to Establish Interdisciplinary Teams?

- Example AURIC Major Grants Program
 - Real money \$200,000 (\$100K/yr, 2 yrs)
 - Must be interdisciplinary
 - Must be led one or more Pls with a "track record"
 - No leverage requirement
 - Pre pre-proposal meeting mandatory for Pl
 - Pre-proposal review
 - Proposal review, revision, resubmission
 - Award, monitoring, presenting
